New Directions: Faster Publication

- Add the newest six months, drop the oldest = 12 months of data
- Third mid-year publication was April 2, 2015
- Annual will be in early September





New Directions Better After-Tax Income Data

- Estimating Federal and State income taxes for the Interview Survey, as presented by Aaron Cobet yesterday.
 - National Bureau of Economic Research (NBER) TaxSim Model
 - Online at http://www.nber.org/~taxsim/
 - Started in the second quarter of 2013, so the complete 12 months were first published with the mid-year tables in April 2015.


Improvements to the Public Use Microdata

- Additional tax liability details

- (Hopefully) NEW demographic variables and cross-tabulations


