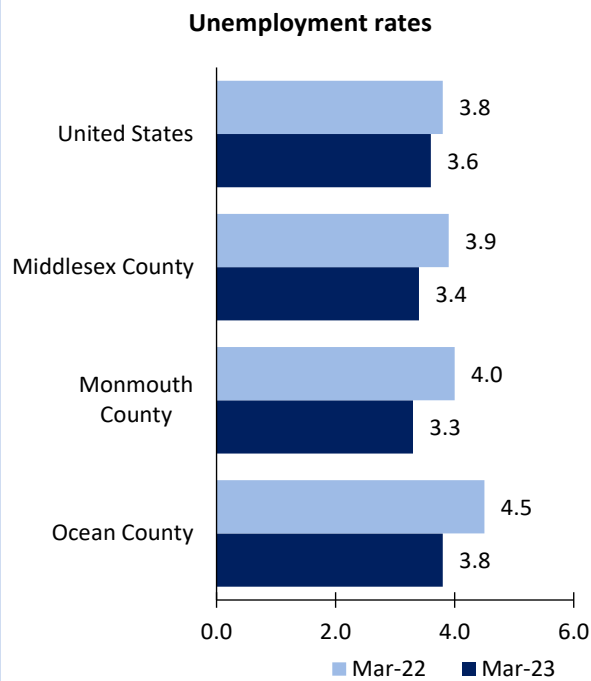


Middlesex-Monmouth-Ocean Area Economic Summary

Average weekly wages for all industries by county

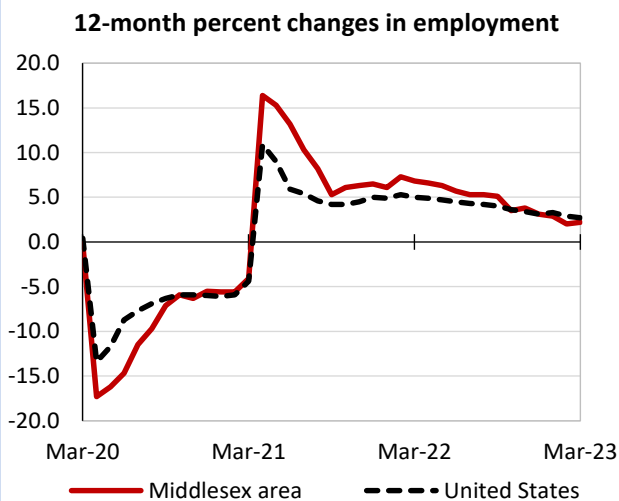
Middlesex area, third quarter 2022

Over-the-year changes in employment on nonfarm payrolls and employment by major industry sector



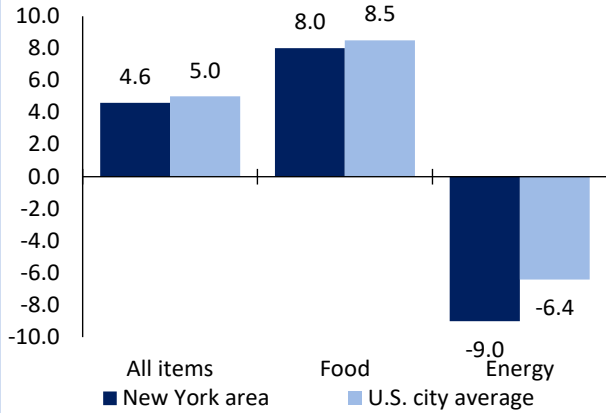

Over-the-year change in the prices paid by urban consumers for selected categories

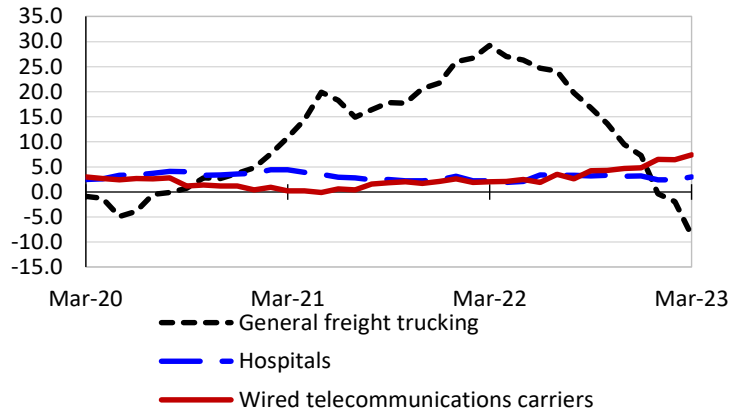
12-month percent change in CPI-U, March 2023

Over-the-year changes in the selling prices received by producers for selected industries nationwide

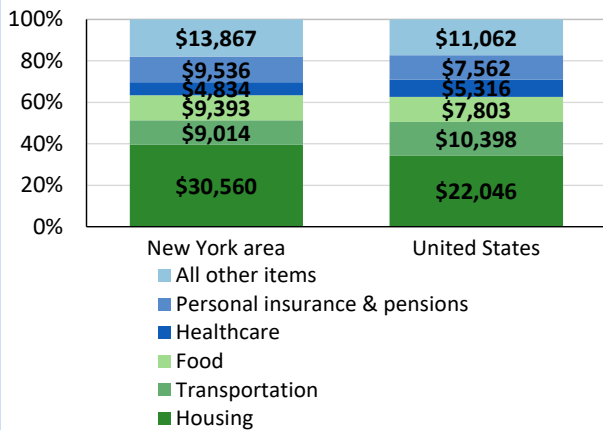
12-month percent changes in PPI

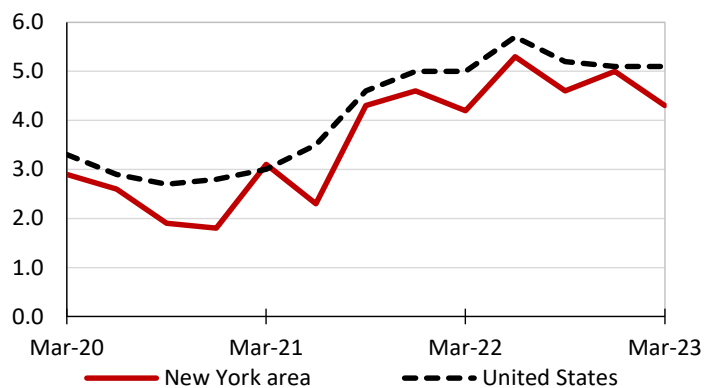
